There was also a discussion about the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade. The participation application needs to be completed. The consensus was that the organization would like to participate as its own entry and not as part of the "No on 710" Group.

**City Council Liaison Report**

At the April 19<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting there was a discussion about the concerns of the parking on the street, due to the new development that took the place of the Abbott Labs site.

There was a report and discussion about a home that had applied for a remodel permit and would be demolished. Approval was granted.

At the May 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting there was a reception and recognition of the service of leaving City Manager Sergio Gonzalez. There was also discussion about pocket parks on Caltrans properties. A RFP (request for proposal) for the lease and

operation of the equestrian stables was discussed, as well as the strategic plan for the library.

The City Council agreed to terminate the joint association for the fire department, as it was found that it is not working as desired. There were not enough benefits in the agreement. It also made it difficult to promote South Pasadena fire personnel.

The City Council also recognized the efforts that had been taking place in developing the new General Plan.

### **Public Safety Commission Report**

There is an effort to “Map Your Neighborhood.” The fire association will change from three cities participating to two cities. We are currently down 4 paramedics in regards to staffing and down 3 engineers in the South Pasadena Fire Department. We are recruiting to fill the vacant positions.

Elaine Aguilar is acting as an interim City Manager for the City. She is retired and had worked for the City of Sierra Madre. A formal search will be conducted for a new, full-time City Manager.

### **Points of Interest**

Compliments were extended to Betty Emirhanian for her efforts in the development and work on the weekly WISPPA calendar.

It was also shared that the City Council will be taking up the issue of the sale of live animals at the May 17, 2017 council meeting. This is to address the issue of puppies and cats that come from “Puppy Mills.”

### **Approval of Minutes**

A motion for approval of the April 2017 minutes was made by Barbara Sinclair and seconded by Clarice Knapp. The membership voted in majority for approval.

### **Guest Brad Colernick and the May 6<sup>th</sup> South Pasadena Eclectic Music Festival**

Brad is a resident who is a successful musical composer and performer. He has lived in South Pasadena since 2001.
